Suggested fields to be completed on form:

- 1. Name
- 2. Title and Affiliation
- 3. Contact info: email, phone, fax, physical address (the last optional)
- 4. Organism(s) of interest: scientific and common names
- 5. Larger taxon or division: eg, Marine invertebrate, Plant, Fungus, Insect
- 6. Location or site of project: physical location, habitat type, physiographic division, region of state
- 7. Description of Project: aim or intent of project, activities, duration, timing (may be abstract from most-recent publication or grant proposal)
- 8. Findings or Points of Interest: (optional)
- 9. Funding source (optional)
- 10. Persons or groups involved: may be student or community groups, clubs, etc as well as the principal investigator or agency personnel
- 11. Would welcome contact from? Helpers, labor, other researchers, someone with specific knowledge of the life cycle of plum curculio, etc.

Questions Regarding Survey Instrument

- 1. What information should be included (see attached)?
- 2. What is the best scale for the larger taxon grouping?
- 3. How should the instrument be distributed? Via email, fax, USPS
- 4. Should it be able to be completed on-line at MISC's website? Only? Paper copies? If so, what office will receive responses and input to website database?
