 - Possibly have a multi-tiered list, e.g. Class II, III, III...
 - o What about cultivars?

- Areas also heavily infested with multiflora rose access issues

Agency Updates

- MDA Carol Holko, Lane Heimer, Pete Rupp
 - Weed Control
 - Very busy for listed noxious weeds and other invasives
 - Treated thistle re-growing because of rain
 - Carole Bergmann thanked program for help with invasives
 - Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)
 - One EAB adult female caught on purple prism trap, <1/2 mile from Charles County line, ~3.4 miles from farthest known infested tree
 - >900 traps statewide, only one positive outside EZ
 - Two VA detections in Fairfax County, Herndon and Springfield
 - Update and combined map posted on <u>http://www.mda.state.md.us/plants-pests/eab/current.php</u>
 - Gypsy moth Task Force underway to assess program priorities
 - Imported fire ant three positives, all old sites.
 - DNR Kerrie Kyde, Marek Topolski Sarah Widman
 - WLBG starting density surveys
 - Extensive populations of Shenandoah Nund in VA on > 70 acres
 - Western part of Shenendoah National Park
 - Western Faulkier County
 - PLS with Bob Trumbule will release last of beetles; thanks to Eric Duce for reporting PLS plants at Sandy Point State Park garden
 - o Mitten crabs in Delaware Bay and Hudson River
 - Blue catfish informal diet study underway
 - Two snakeheads found in Anacostia R. in rocky, fast-moving water different from slow moving water thought to be preferred
 - Rusty crayfish regulations adopted
 - Positive response from angler community to Didymo washing stations
 - Need to decide what ANS to add to prohibited list per new regs.
 - MacKnight, Kyde, Holko did live call-in show on invasive species Dan Roderick's Midday program on WYPR
- MDE Chris Luckett
 - Citizen complaints
 - Middle River area, Baltimore County salinity drops in wet year, extension of range of Eurasian water milfoil, and filamentous green algae, seasonal problem
 - Biocontrol work done in New England
 - Snakehead reported in Upper Marlboro, not in Patuxent referred to DNR
 - 55 stations using non-native clams in cages to monitor for PCB's in non-tidal Potomac (revenge is side benefit)
- APHIS –AI Tasker
 - Rebecca Bech new PPQ Deputy Administrator
 - o 7cfr360 ANPR moving forward, will add 7 species to regulated list, not published yet
 - ARS National Program Leader job is currently advertised until mid-October

- Kudzu for biofuel profitable method of eliminating kudzu, intent is to harvest existing patches on agricultural land and replant with non-invasive biofuel plant, <u>NOT</u> plant kudzu as crop

Carol Holko

- MDA and The South River Foundation, as part of a Targeted Watershed Initiative funded by a grant from the Chesapeake Bay Trust, are cooperating on stormwater solution project, using three "bio-retention cells" at MDA HQ using structure and plants to reduce the velocity of stormwater in Broad Creek (headwaters behind AA County Health Department) and to filter pollutants from runoff.
