- Will move to Senate Education Health and Environmental Affairs Committee

Agency Updates

MDA – Bob Trumbule, Carol Holko,

- Eastern Branch Entomological Society of America meeting BMSB major topic of discussion, will be major issue this year in mid-Atlantic - "Biblical"; biocontrol may help; MISC should link to more information
- EAB ARS cooler at Cheltenham, adult EAB for DE rearing lab, monitor parasitoid recovery
- Sudden Oak Death Federal order requiring nurseries in regulated areas to provide advance notification of high risk host plant shipments to non-regulated areas as of March 1. Receiving states being asked to manage and administer the provisions.
- Weed Control County programs in trouble, need to be self sustaining now without MDA grants cut from budget in 2010

MDNR - Kerrie, Marek

- State forests undergoing sustainability certification process clear need for training of foresters and maintenance staff regarding invasive plant management; would like information on portable wash stations
- More wader cleaning stations for didymo
- Felt soled wader ban regulation goes into effect Tuesday
- Invasive Species Matrix Team discussing promoting public destruction of invasive species; danger in putting value on invasive species; "invasivore" movement
- DNR working on cooperative regulations with Virginia for blue catfish

SHA – Bill K.

 Continued cooperation with MDA Weed Control and IPM programs regarding noxious and invasive weeds

APHIS - Matt, Jim

- Asian gypsy moth inspection PPQ joint vessel boarding with CBP
- National recall of lemon trees sold to homeowners via Internet and catalog sales from quarantined areas

- ALB documentary Lurking in the Trees on YouTube and iTunes, cooperative with TNC
- Q37 regulations affecting post entry quarantine, 60-90 days to final rule
 - Compliant with ISPM 5 glossary of phytosanitary terms
 - Several layers of permits, effectively do away with Departmental permits
 - Five risk categories with different performance standards risk assessment will be useful for soon-to-be Maryland IPAC
 - o Post entry quarantine changes? Process for adding or eliminating genera.

Plant invasiveness included in risk assessment? Yes.

- Dulles 2nd khapra beetle find press release last night
- Interception of CAPS pest in cargo from China
- Over past year more than 30 interceptions of six species of "dirt colored seed bugs" seed pests, two species established in Oregon causing economic damage; hitchhiking on no particular
- Spike in interceptions of stink bug, Rhaphinogaster sp., from Europe, similar in appearance to BMSB – clear part of wing has brown bars on BMSB v. brown spots on new species; not known to be established in U.S.; USDA won't regulate BMSB – list of regulated articles would be infinite, focus on management
- BWI now has flights to/from Cuba

ARS - John

 \$43M cut from budget in latest continuing resolution, eliminated pass through money and earmarks; 2012 additional cuts
