#### **Agency Updates**

## Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR)

- Chronic wasting disease has been confirmed in 4 deer in Allegany county within the quarantine area
  - 6 total confirmed cases statewide
  - DNR is pinpointing exact locations with hunters
- Invasive Plant Advisory Committee (IPAC)
  - John Peter Thompson, Sylvan Kaufman, and Kerrie Kyde are conducting weed risk assessments
  - First list of Tier 1 / 2 species is scheduled to be drafted by April
  - IPAC members will review draft list and make recommendations to MDA secretary at next meeting
- Invasive Species Matrix Team
  - Working on creating hands-on samples for educational displays (crayfish, water chestnut seeds, etc.)
  - Draft invasive species response plan for aquatic species has been prepared
    - Terrestrial plan may come later
- Forest Service
  - Acting State Forester Donald VanHassent
  - Update on thousand cankers sent to licensed tree experts and forest product operators with license renewals
  - Applied for 2 year grant to assist with Emerald Ash Borer
  - Biodiversity Hotspots
    - Grant wraps up this year
    - Developing database structure for long-term management
    - Focusing on identifying invasive species threats where rare and endangered species are located

## • University of Maryland

- Ralstonia solanacearum (southern bacteria wilt) was recently shipped on cuttings of Osteospermum
  - Bacterium that infects vascular system of herbaceous plants
    - Can cause southern wilt in tobacco, tomato, and other vegetables
  - Shipment originated from greenhouse in Guatemala
  - Grower worked with USDA-APHIS to contain outbreak and stop shipments
  - USDA-APHIS determined that Ralstonia strain in the outbreak was not the select agent strain that is cold tolerant
- Mid-Atlantic Early Detection Network (MAEDN)
  - App is under development
  - Current app is used mostly for ID purposes
    - Trying to increase the use of the app for reporting
  - Any suggestions on improving the app are welcome

## • Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA)

- o Acting Plant Protection & Weed Management Program Manager Kim Rice
- Thousand cankers disease quarantine area is official
  - Cecil county Fair Hill NRMA
- o Boxwood Blight
  - Has been a problem on Eastern Shore
  - 2 nurseries have tested positive
    - Had to destroy plants, containers, and leaf mat and sanitize all equipment
  - Worcester county homeowner had a confirmed case
  - Has recently been found in landscapes in Baltimore county-eradication efforts taken
- Biocontrol continuing partnership with MD State Highway Administration for mile-aminute weevil with MDA continuing to rear, release and monitor weevil. Also continuing to partner with NJ Dept of Ag for additional supply of weevils
- Weed Control
  - Montgomery County is drafting a bill that restricts pesticide applications
  - Current draft is more restrictive than State/Federal regulations and could result in suspending operations until it can be proven that they are absolutely necessary

## • Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA)

- o Continuing mile-a-minute weevil partnership with MDA
- Work continues on Integrated Roadside Vegetation Management (IRVM) program
  - New round of contracts is slated to be advertised this year
  - SHA has been struggling with the permitting process with Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE)
    - MDE commented on draft specifications
      - Initial list of targeted invasive species was submitted and MDE does not want SHA to control mile-a-minute, Japanese honeysuckle, common teasel, or canary reed grass in sensitive sites under MDE jurisdiction
        - Unclear whether there are concerns over treatment/control operations associated with these species or if MDE actually wants these species growing in these areas
      - MDE may require decontamination procedures similar to those used for didymo
    - Additional discussions will follow until permit is received
  - First project is slated to advertise February 24, 2015

#### Anne Arundel County

- Emerald Ash Borer
  - Recently purchased an iQ tree infuser
  - Looking to try it out at Jug Bay
  - DPW-Highways is taking a proactive approach in treating trees
  - ArborMectin pesticide is being used
    - Not labeled for aquatic use unless it is injected above the water line
    - Not labeled as 'restricted use'

## • Friends of Deep Creek Lake (DCL)

- National Sea Grant Law Center is a resource for watercraft inspection/decontamination legislation
- DNR has informed DCL that milfoil is too extensive and would be too expensive to control at the lake
- o Hiring a lobbyist to draft model legislation
  - Need to work out funding issues

## • Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee

- o Town has 5 parks, of which 3 are targeted for regular invasive removal work
- o Thanks to Marc Imlay for spraying lesser celandine and Japanese knotweed in the other 2 areas
- Town has recognized Randy Phoebus and Marc Imlay as Champions of Cheverly Green Infrastructure for their invasives control work
  - Last 2 sessions to remove English ivy have been very successful 10 and 20 volunteers, respectively. One more session is needed to complete work.

## • Howard County Master Gardeners

 Meeting once a month to remove invasives - 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month at Middle Patuxent Environmental Area

## • Maryland Association of Pet Industries

- o Montgomery County is considering new legislation on puppy and kitten sales
- o Legislation on feral cats for trap/neuter/release will be heard next week

# • The Nature Conservancy

- o Thank you to DNR for Hemlock Woolly Adelgid Control
  - Several thousand trees have been treated
  - Looking into biocontrol options
- o TNC will not have any seasonal invasive species crews at this time, but will be looking into alternative funding sources

## • Rockville Native Species Network

- A joint project among the City of Rockville, Montgomery County's Pope Farm Nursery, and Rockville volunteers will occur in September
- Invasive plants will be replaced with native grasses in a meadow at the Croydon Creek Nature Center, a Rockville City park
- Volunteers recruited through an advertisement in Rockville's Recreation and Parks Guide will supply labor
- Montgomery County's Pope Farm Nursery (MNCPP) will supply 100 gallon pots of native grasses
- o The City will supply a sign identifying the collaborative nature of the project
